## Coach Development News

### Coach Tutor Conference

Coach tutors from the majority of the EF regions attended the Coach Tutor Conference held on 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> June in Nottingham. The aim of the conference was to provide an opportunity to discuss the future of coach education and development.

The topics up for discussion included:

- Current successes and challenges in coach development
- Current context and latest initiatives in state school fencing
- The role of the lead tutor
- The role of the National Academy
- Current coach tutor support and future requirements
- New terms, conditions and development processes for coach tutors

The conference included briefings on current initiatives and plenty of discussion and debate in a plenary session. The atmosphere throughout was open, with a clear desire by the group to work together to enhance the effectiveness of the coach education. Feedback from participants at the conference was uniformly positive. The chance to work with other coach tutors to discuss and exchange ideas was seen as being the most successful elements of the event.

The intention is that key issues from the debate will be set into a formalised process for administering coach development programmes.

### Certificate of Tutoring in Sport

Ten delegates gathered in Nottingham on 25<sup>th</sup> June for a three-day introductory programme for the award of the Certificate of Tutoring in Sport (CTS). An Introduction to Assessment Practice in Sport (IAPS) was also available to delegates at the event. The selectees for this training were a mix of coaches and workforce trainers (Armoury and Refereeing). The CTS and IAPS qualification is the nationally recognised standard for coach education. The group were selected to attend because it was felt that they would be the coach tutors of the future. British Fencing's lead tutors will be instrumental in assisting the delegates to complete their programme by observing them co-tutor on courses.

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## Schools Fencing – Change4Life

Whilst we await final details of the Change4Life School Sport Club initiative, some useful preparatory work has been undertaken and we shall be ready to hit the ground running when we get the go-ahead. A two-day training design forum was held on 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> June to analyse and outline the necessary training for the project. We appointed a training designer to write 40 lesson plans and prepare a compendium of fencing-related games and exercises, and a promotional video was shot in an East London school.

Schools opting to start up a fencing club next September are champing at the bit and have begun making enquiries of their existing fencing contacts or sourcing local coaches. If you are an SSCo, PDM, coach or club, here's what you need to know:

- Any and all training will commence in September for Sept and Oct start-ups, and in Nov/Dec for Jan 11 start-ups...
- We will group SSPs together for training courses so no one has to travel too far (we are trying to keep to 45 minutes drive time)...
- We'll be concentrating on the soft form of the game using simple plastic masks and plastic foils...
- There will be a fully supported training programme for teachers/leaders, with text-based and DVD-based resources including 40 session plans and a games compendium, as well as live practical training.
- We can advise schools on the best way to allocate funds from their start-up grants to properly resource the fencing club.

## North East Development News

Teaching the teachers to teach – mini-fencing.

Since the Regional Development programme in the North East started in 2008, requests for fencing in schools have grown by over 300%. An encouraging reason for this is through the popularity of mini-fencing with fun training and coach development activities taking place across the region.

In a recent Mini-fence for Teachers course that took place in Blyth Valley near Newcastle, 12 sports coaches took part and are now delivering in the local area in schools and community centres. This one-day nationally recognised course is not only setting standards for delivery of the plastic version of fencing but is also enabling those new to fencing

to be able to deliver up to 10 weeks of session plans.

The relatively quick training, confidence and enjoyment elements of the course have proved so popular, that the coaches are now starting to enrol on the Level 1 BF and EF courses so they can graduate to the metal version.

A total of 45 mini-fencing coaches have so far completed the course in the region, with many delivering in schools, universities, community clubs and sports centres. The next course is being held at Hartlepool on the 6<sup>th</sup> July. Please contact Beth Davidson, North East Regional Development Officer. ## England Fencing News

Applications are invited from clubs, counties and regions for grants to support projects that will develop fencing. Grants up to a maximum of £300 each will be awarded subject to available funds. (For projects requiring a larger grant, consider [Sport England Small Grants](#))

Applications for grants for projects which measurably enhance the links between a local school or School Sport Partnership and a region, county union or club, and/or applications for grants for projects which are directly concerned with coach development, will receive priority. All clubs or coaches benefiting from the grant must be members of England Fencing.

Grants will be decided by an awards panel comprising three members of the England Fencing Executive Board. Applications will be considered in 3-monthly rounds while funds allow.

**The deadline for the first funding round will be 16th July 2010.**
